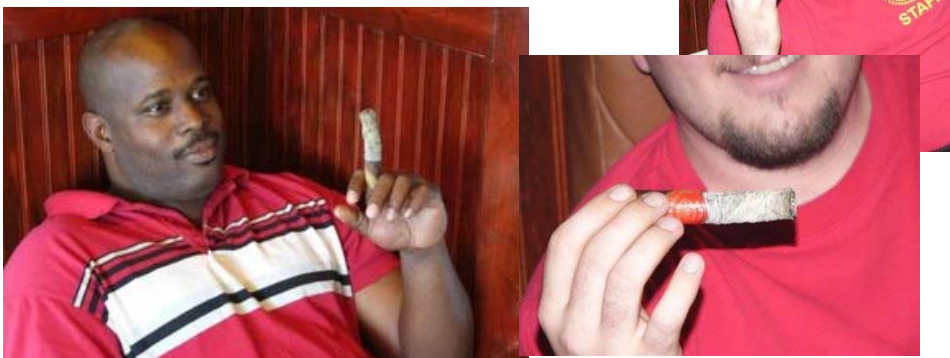
### A CIGAR TASTING
